TSGLI ADL Standard for Continence

Please note the following examples are for illustrative purposes only and are not intended to be all inclusive.

Continence

▶ To meet the ADL standard for continence, you must:

Have Colostomy Bag/Catheter	Do NOT Have Colostomy Bag/Catheter
Require the assistance of another person to change and manage your colostomy bag/catheter.	Be partially or totally unable to control your bowel and/or bladder function.

Continence Examples

- <u>Unable</u> to Maintain Continence Independently
 - You have a catheter/colostomy bag and are unable to change and clean it, and dispose of waste.
 - You soil your undergarments with urine or feces on a daily basis.
- Able to Maintain Continence Independently
 - You have a catheter/colostomy bag and are able to change and clean it, and dispose of waste.
 - You have urinary leakage once a week in your underwear.
