The Transition Assistance Program (TAP) provides training, information, and services to help Service members and their families transition to civilian life after the military. The goal of the program is to help Service members bridge their military experiences and skills with their post-military goals by planning for transition throughout their Military Life Cycle (MLC).

At key touch points throughout MLC, TAP delivers modules to inform Service members about benefits and services available to support them during their careers and after separation or retirement. The VA Vet Centers module presents key information about the importance of Vet Centers as a free resource for active duty Service members, Veterans, and their families.

To search for your local Vet Center:

- Go to www.va.gov
- Select the **Find a VA Location** tab from the top menu.
- Complete the **Search near** field by entering a location which can be a street, city, state, or ZIP code.
- Select **Vet Center** from the facility type **Search for** drop-down field.
- Once you select an option from the **Search for** drop-down field, the **Service type (optional)** field populates with specific facilities that are optional to choose from.
